# **EIELSON AFB RESTRICTION OF MOVEMENT (ROM) GUIDANCE**



#### 17 May 21

### Stop the Spread – Remain Fully Mission Capable

**What:** <u>Mandatory</u> Restriction of Movement (ROM) Procedures. ROM is travel-related unlike isolation and quarantine which are medically-directed.

**Who:** <u>All personnel</u> traveling from locations outside of Alaska (including returning Eielson personnel, TDY personnel, transient aircrew, new inbounds, civilians, visitors, family members, etc.).

When: <u>0 days</u> for "fully vaccinated" personnel (explanation below) <u>10 days</u> for personnel *not* fully vaccinated (potential modifications below).

> \*This guidance does <u>not</u> cover medical isolation and quarantine, defined as follows: Medical Isolation – person tested positive for COVID-19 Medical Quarantine – person having close contact with someone testing positive for COVID-19

## **ROM PROCEDURES:**

- Personnel who are <u>fully vaccinated</u> (2 weeks after the second dose of a two-shot series or 2 weeks after one dose in a single-shot series) are <u>not required to ROM</u> upon arrival in Alaska.
- Personnel who are <u>not fully vaccinated</u> and have returned from out-of-state domestic or international travel will enter a 10-day ROM.
  - During the 10-day ROM, personnel <u>may not</u> dine at sit-down eating establishments.
- All Eielson-assigned inbound or returning TDY personnel must:
  - Adhere to latest Alaska travel guidance for residents while off-base.
  - Wear a mask and maintain 6 feet of distance from anyone outside your household, on or off-base, for 10 days (if not fully vaccinated).
  - Unless otherwise directed, personnel are not restricted to base (must follow Alaska guidelines off base).

#### **ROM MODIFICATIONS:**

These modifications do not apply to medical isolation or quarantine requirements.

- Unit Commanders will ensure ROM requirements for non-fully vaccinated personnel are met.
  - Commanders may modify ROM procedures and conditions for non-fully vaccinated based on the following:
    - Mission requirements
    - <u>Ability to maintain social distancing in work areas upon return</u>
    - Travel exposure risk and itinerary during travel
    - Ability to isolate COVID-19 spread in the event of an infection
    - COVID-19 conditions in areas of travel and workplace
    - Any test results received upon return travel into Alaska
- If unable to ensure 6 feet of physical distancing and mask wear on duty, Commanders will consider:
  - Alternate duty locations
  - "Test out" options
  - Cohort/shift management
- Additional guidance and/or restrictions apply to personnel TDY. Reference exercise-specific COVID guidance.
- Subject to unit commander approval, non-fully vaccinated visitors may complete travel restriction of

movement (ROM) in on-base residences. For additional guidance, see Handout: Friends and Family Guidance.

If you develop any COVID-19 symptoms (fever, cough, loss of taste or smell, or other flu-like symptoms), **DO NOT GO TO WORK**. Isolate yourself from others, inform your chain of command, and contact the 354 MDG at (907) 377-1847.
