SUBJECT: Eielson Air Force Base, Alaska Environmental Policy Statement

1. Eielson Air Force Base (AFB) provides critical combat training for the United States (U.S.) and allied aviation forces. It serves as a strategic location for U.S. interests in the Asia-Pacific region while deploying Airmen in support of Air Force operations worldwide. Commitment to environmental stewardship and quality allows us to contribute the full effect of our assets to national security in a manner that conveys a positive image of the Air Force to the public at large.

While Eielson AFB complies with all federal, state, and local environmental regulations, my vision is that all personnel on this installation will adopt an environmentally conscious perspective and look to find ways to improve the way our operations interact with our environment. Many activities routinely performed across Eielson AFB have the potential for detrimental environmental impacts. It is the duty of all commanders, via unit environmental coordinators, and the Environmental Management System (EMS), to monitor and track their unit impacts, and establish threshold objectives in order to drive negative impacts toward zero.
3. To this end, Eielson AFB commits to superior environmental stewardship and to:
  - a. Integrating environmental information and training to all organization levels.
  - b. Evaluating and mitigating environmental impacts in all plans, programs, and strategies.
  - c. Incorporating technological processes to improve mission capability and the environment.
  - d. Developing goals and targets to achieve compliance and meet objectives of the EMS.
  - e. Committing to continual improvement and pollution prevention.
4. I am committed to supporting and improving Eielson AFB's environmental policy and posture and request that all of you lean forward with me in that commitment.
